Competition Brief for Entrants 8 - 11

Brief

The competition is to design environmentally friendly, practical products using things that we would normally throw away, for a chance to win the **POWERWING**™

Waste item – the waste products can be any type of re-usable waste you would find in the home, and you may use as many types of waste as you wish. There will be extra points for using products which are not recycled by your own local Council. Please give reasons for why you chose specific items.

Be imaginative – the purpose of the competition is to encourage innovative ways in which a home can be energy efficient and environmentally friendly. Entries will be judged on innovative ideas, practicality, durability and presentation.

Use the sheet provided and the panel on the side to describe what makes your ideas unique.

Format

The entries can be hand drawn or computer generated. Original or thought-provoking presentation is encouraged. But please stick to the sheet size and format provided.

The drawings of the Waste to Wonder design can be drawn from any angle you believe best shows off your ideas, and indicate and describe any construction details and how it is made. Use whatever format, or combination of formats, you feel best expresses your ideas.

Things to consider

Practicality

Consider the practicalities of your product and how it would be useful as a new item, and what its uses would be.

Durability

Think about how durable and long lasting your item will be in the future. It will not be greatly economically beneficial if it can only be used once more.

Materials

Any kind of waste material, specifically those your council may not recycle.

Consider the materials qualities and think about how they can be used for a new function or design.
